Livestock Entry Fees

Entry fees are per individual class entry and are set at £2.50 per animal where the class shows an individual animal, or, £2.50 per group where the class shows a group entry.

The appropriate fees must be sent to the Secretary with your entry.

Entries with no fee, or the incorrect fee, enclosed will not be accepted until the correct fee is received.

Any Animal entered into the show with unpaid fees will forfeit any prizes won at the show.

REGULATIONS

Livestock may be refused entry to the Grand Parade unless properly halter trained - at the Safety Steward's & Parade Steward's discretion

- 1 The competition in stock, unless otherwise stated, is open to all members of the Nairnshire Farming Society and to all farmers in the County.
- 2 All cattle stock must be genuinely the property of, and in possession of, the exhibitor.
- 3 All sheep stock must be genuinely the property of, and in possession of, the exhibitor for two months prior to the show.
- 4 Challenge cups and special prizes are open for competition to all competitors unless otherwise stated.
- 5 All stock and other exhibits must be on the ground by **8:30am and cannot be removed until after the Grand Parade.**
- 6 **Entries must be made to the Secretary on or before 30th June on forms supplied, with correct entry fee. Exhibitors who have failed to pay their entry fee will forfeit any prize money won on show day.**
- 7 The age of stock in beef cattle sections to be calculated from 1st October, unless otherwise stated.
- 8 No bull may be shown unless properly controlled.
- 9 For prizes given by the Society, no animal shall be allowed to enter in more than one class, or to compete in any class, except that prescribed for animals of its pedigree and description.
- 10 Exhibitors are alone responsible for the accuracy and eligibility of the entries in the catalogue.
- 11 The judges are empowered to withhold prizes in any class where the exhibits are not considered worthy of prizes.
- 12 Where a prize is offered for "the most successful exhibitor" or "for the competitor obtaining most points", the award will be made to the competitor having the highest aggregate marks in the section concerned, calculated as follows: For a first prize - 4 marks; second 3 marks, third 2 marks, commended 1 mark. (In the event of a tie, one mark will be added to the aggregate of each candidate for every exhibit he made before the judges in the section concerned.)
- 13 No protest will be considered unless made in writing, and accompanied by a deposit of £5, to the Secretary by 2pm on the day of the show. The deposit will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
- 14 All persons in charge of stock or other exhibits shall be subject to the order of the committee, the attending members, or the Secretary.
- 15 The committee will not be responsible if any exhibit is not turned out for judging when called.
- 16 Any member or competitor offering insulting language to a judge, member of committee, official or attending member, or otherwise misconducting himself, shall, in the option of the committee, forfeit all entry money and prizes and, in the case of a member, be liable to expulsion from the Society.
- 17 The Society will not be in any way responsible for any loss or damage which stock, implements or articles of any description may sustain at the show or in transit, or for any accident to any person within or without the showyard.
- 18 Any unregistered pure female or registered steer may be shown in Section 8.
- 19 Where the Society is affiliated to breed societies, their show regulations also apply.

NOTE - if the meaning of any of the fore-mentioned rules is questioned, the final interpretation of them shall lie with the President's committee.

In order to facilitate attention by stockmen, exhibitors' entries in the cattle section will, where practicable, be housed or stalled together.

NORTH SHOWS CIRCUIT YOUNG FARMERS' CALF COMPETITION

Competition Rules

1. The competition is open to members of the Young Farmers aged 14 and over, and under 26
2. Participating Agricultural Shows:- Caithness, Black Isle, Grantown, Nairn, Sutherland
3. The points for this competition are awarded to the animal
4. **Ear tags must be entered prior to show day**
5. There is no limit to the number of entries from one person as the points follow the animal
6. The entrant to show a calf born on or after 1st March of year prior to show year
7. There will be 2 Pedigree classes and 2 Commercial classes at each show – calf born between 1st March & 1st September AND calf born between 2nd September and show day.
8. If there is a large entry, the class will be split into stot & heifer sections
9. 2 points will be awarded to every entrant
10. In each class, points will be awarded to the first 5 animals: –
1st - 5 points, 2nd – 4 points, 3rd – 3 points, 4th – 2 points, 5th – 1 point
11. The winners in each of the 2 Pedigree Classes will go head to head with points being awarded:
1st (Pedigree YF Champion) – 5 points, 2nd (Reserve) - 3 points
12. The winners in each of the 2 Commercial Classes will go head to head with points being awarded:
1st (Commercial YF Champion) – 5 points, 2nd (Reserve) - 3 points
13. The Overall Young Farmers' Calf Champion & Reserve at each show will be judged between the Pedigree YF champion & the Commercial YF champion
14. The show Overall Young Farmers' Calf Champion = 10 points
15. The show Overall Young Farmers' Calf Reserve = 5 points
16. At each show, the points will be recorded, with a winner emerging at the final show of the year
17. In the event of a draw at the final show of the year, the umpire will make the final decision
18. To be considered, any animal involved in a 'draw situation', must be present at the final show
19. A Commercial calf must not be shown in any other class in the Commercial Section
20. The highest placed Commercial Calf can compete for the Commercial Champion
21. A Pedigree calf may be shown in another Pedigree class but cannot compete for Commercial Champion
22. The Overall Champion and Reserve at each show will be judged by the Commercial judge
23. Prize money at each participating show: –
Champion - £50, Reserve - £30 (provided by each show)
24. Prize money annually: –
Champion - £100 : Reserve - £25 : Animal which participates at most shows - £25
25. The competition will be administered by each of the participating shows in turn, starting with Sutherland then in alphabetical order
26. Annual prize winners to be presented at the prize giving of the administrating show
27. Engraving of the trophy to be responsibility of the administrating show
